Assigning Evaluation and Management Code Levels

Assigning E&M Code Levels 2 Notes/Comments History • History of present illness Seven parameters: • Location-where it is • Duration- how long you have had it • Timing- when it occurs • Context- what you are doing when it occurs • Severity- how bad is it • Modifying factors- what makes it better or worse • Associated signs and symptoms-what else do

Complete Health History Biographic information
