ELIMINATION DISORDERS ENCOPRESIS What it is: Encopresis is a disorder that is typically found in young children, over the age of 4 The essential characteristic of encopresis is the repeated passage of faeces into inappropriate places, such as in clothing or on the floor Most often this passage

The Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM) is the manual used by clinicians and researchers to diagnose and classify mental disorders (including substance use disorders [SUDs]) The DSM specifically classifies child disorders by symptoms, duration, and functional impact across home, school, and other community settings

Results: The total rate of psychiatric disorders among children and adolescent was estimated as 205%, elimination disorders with a rate of 129% was the most prevalent disorder in the subjects

Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition ELIMINATION DISORDERS ENURESIS What it is: Enuresis a disorder in which an individual repeatedly empties their bladder during the day or night into their clothes or bed Most often the emptying of the bladder is involuntary, however it may sometimes be intentional
