Evidence on: Eye Ointment for Newborns

Answer: Eye ointment is given to newborns to prevent pink eye in the first month of life, called ophthalmia neonatorum (ON) The ointment is meant to kill bacteria in the eye—mainly gonorrhoea, a sexually transmitted infection If left untreated, pink eye from gonorrhoea can cause serious eye damage and blindness in as little as 24 hours
