Just Culture: The Key to Quality and Safety

• A just culture recognizes that individual practitioners should not be held accountable for system failings over which they have no control • A just culture also recognizes many errors represent predictable interactions between human operators and the systems in which they work Recognizes that competent professionals make mistakes
