Managing Passive-Aggressive Behavior Definition Passive-Aggressive behavior is characterized by passivity and aggression in which forceful actions or attitudes are expressed in an indirect, nonviolent manner, such as pouting, obstructionism, procrastination, inefficiency, stubbornness, and forgetfulness Sugar-Coated Hostility
