Kidney transplant is an optimal treatment for most patients with End Stage Renal Disease 2 Preparation for kidney transplant should start 1-2 years of dialysis 3 Kidney transplant is not an absolute contraindication for patients who demonstrated non-compliance w/ meds 4 Cardiovascular risk is reduced or avoided when ESRD

Routine nursing care: • We do vital signs every 4 hours at a minimum, even overnight • Each nurse you have will do a full assessment of you and your symptoms They will listen to your heart and lungs, look in your mouth, ask you questions about pain, nausea, diarrhea, etc
