The Obstetrical Triage Improvement Project (OB TIP)

• Initial triage process (10 -20 minutes) requires 1 RN: 1 woman (includes fetal assessment) • Ratio can change to 1: 2-3 as maternal-fetal status is determined to be stable • Ratio should be 1: 2-3 during non-stress testing AWHONN Professional Practice Guidelines Future Directions • Trial proposed “best practice” triage

Obstetric Triage Improvement

Obstetric triage is a multidisciplinary, multivariable, complex specialty within the labor and delivery unit It is comparable to an emergency department, with unpredictable census, chief complaints, and unexpected challenges The problem to be addressed in this project is lengthy

Triage is the process of collecting pertinent information about patients who are seeking emergency care and initiating a decision-making procedure that uses a valid and reliable triage acuity designation system¹ Rapid and accurate triage decisions are important for successful emergency department (ED)

Obstetric Triage Guidelines for Perinatal Care (ACOG & AAP) Pregnant women who present to L&D should be evaluated in a timely fashion Initial assessment may be completed by an RN CNM, NP PA, or MD Women should be cared for according to acuity rather than by time of arrival The person performing triage should assign acuity during first

Obstetric Guidelines: Management of COVID-19 Positive/PUI ...

Guidelines for Hospital Arrival 1 Patient should NOT be sent to L&D or Triage for non-OB issues 2 Patients who are < 20 weeks (or gestational age per hospital policy) can be cared for in the Emergency Department Testing will occur in the ED if warranted 3 All patients who present to L&D Triage >20 weeks with OB issues, are
