The AAOS believes that Performance Enhancing Drugs (PEDs), such as anabolic steroids and their precursors, should not be used to enhance performance or appearance, and should be banned from use in all sports programs We recommend that sports-governing bodies continue implementing aggressive drug testing programs to deter and to detect drug use
