Byron Nelson was one of golf's greatest legends. And he continued to play top-caliber golf with the greats of the game, like Hogan, Jack Nicklaus, and Arnold Palmer, and some who were less than great—President Eisenhower, Bing Crosby, Bob Hope, and a host of others. Laced throughout with scores of priceless stories, anecdotes, opinions, and even golf tips, and with an in-depth, event-by-event recreation of his golden year, 1945, *How I Played the Game* is golf writing and remembrance of the highest order—irresistible reading for every golfer and fan.

There, and over the course of their twenty-year friendship, Hogan taught Jody the mechanics of his famous swing and shared his thoughts on playing, practicing, and course management—unknowingly revealing much about his character, values, and beliefs, and the events that shaped them. In *Afternoons with Mr. Hogan*, Jody Vasquez shares dozens of stories about Hogan, from the way he practiced, selected his clubs, and interacted with other star players to his little-known humor and generosity. Combining the gentle insight of Tom Kite's *A Fairway to Heaven* (which recalls Kite's golf education under Harvey Penick) with the sage perspective of Penick's own *Little Red Book*, Vasquez's tribute is funny, poignant, and full of advice for golfers of all levels.
